

Plastering (Solid Basic) NVQ Level 2

In order to qualify for the Plastering NVQ level 2 program you must be a practicing plasterer who can provide sufficient evidence of experience.

You as a candidate will have to attend Chase Tiling Academy centre to complete the initial induction, registration and enrolment paperwork in order to sign up for the NVQ, from then on the NVQ process is completed with the assessor coming to observe you in your workplace.

You are given a maximum of 2 years to complete the award although normally it is completed within 3-6 months.

The units you will need to cover to complete the NVQ level 2 are listed below:

- VR01 - Conform to general workplace safety
- VR02 - Conform to efficient work practices
- VR03 - Move and handle resources
- VR65 - Apply finishing plaster to background surfaces

After completing the NVQ level 2 you may be able to progress onto the NVQ Level 3 in Plastering (solid basic) as long as you can meet the qualification criteria.

Dry Lining NVQ Level 2

In order to qualify for the Dry lining NVQ level 2 program you must be a practicing dry liner who can provide sufficient evidence of experience.

You as a candidate will have to attend Chase Tiling Academy centre to complete the initial induction, registration and enrolment paperwork in order to sign up for the NVQ, from then on the NVQ process is completed with the assessor coming to observe you in your workplace.

You are given a maximum of 2 years to complete the award although normally it is completed within 3-6 months.

The units you will need to cover to complete the NVQ level 2 are listed below:

- VR01 - Conform to general workplace safety
- VR02 - Conform to efficient work practices
- VR03 - Move and handle resources
- VR129 - Install dry lining partition systems
- VR130 - Install dry linings and encasements.

After completing the NVQ level 2 you may be able to progress onto the NVQ Level 3 in Dry lining as long as you can meet the qualification criteria.

What is an NVQ?

NVQ stands for Notional Vocational Qualification. It is a 'competence based' qualification; this means you learn practical work related to tasks designed to help you develop the skills and knowledge to do a job efficiently.

NVQ's are based on national standards for various occupations. The standards say what a competent person in a job could be expected to do. As you progress through the program you compare your skills and knowledge with these standards as you learn, so you can see what you need to do to meet them.

The NVQ is designed for candidates who already have skills and want to improve them.

NVQ's are assessed on practical assignments and a portfolio of evidence. A qualified assessor from Chase Tiling Academy will observe you and question you about the real work you carry out in the workplace. They will test your knowledge and understanding as well as your actual performance.

To qualify for the NVQ program you need to:

- Be employed or self employed in the trade
- Be able to provide job references
- Have an up to date CV
- Be able to provide photographic evidence
- Public Liability Insurance

Wall and floor Tiling NVQ2

In order to qualify for the wall and floor tiling NVQ level 2 program you must be a practicing wall and floor tiler who can provide sufficient evidence of experience.

You as a candidate will have to attend Chase Tiling Academy centre to complete the initial induction, registration and enrolment paperwork in order to sign up for the NVQ, from then on the NVQ process is completed with the assessor coming to observe you in your workplace.

You are given a maximum of 2 years to complete the award although normally it is completed within 3-6 months.

The units you will need to cover to complete the NVQ level 2 are listed below:

- VR01 - Conform to general workplace safety
- VR02 - Conform to efficient work practices
- VR03 - Move and handle resources
- VR141 - Prepare backgrounds
- VR142 - Tile wall and floor surfaces.

After completing the NVQ level 2 you may be able to progress onto the NVQ Level 3 in wall and floor tiling as long as you can meet the qualification criteria.

Wall and floor Tiling NVQ3

Are you ambitious, self driven, motivated to achieve? Do you feel that people do not recognize your full abilities and credentials? Do you personally feel that you have yet to reach your full potential? Are you employed, self employed and need to expand your potential earning options?

It would be an advantage to have achieved an NVQ 2 in tiling but it is not a necessity. If you are in a position where you are employed as a 'hands-on' supervisor/foreman type operative the chances are that you will have access to an abundance of evidence that is applicable to this award.

The units you will need to cover to complete the NVQ level 3 are listed below:

- VR01 - Conform to general workplace safety
- VR209 - Conform to work activities and resources for the work
- VR210 - Develop and maintain good working relationships
- VR211 - Confirm the occupational method of work
- VR69 - Lay sand and cement screeds
- VR141 - Prepare backgrounds for tiling
- VR142 - Tile wall and floor surfaces
- VR143 - Produce tiled, mosaic and stone surface finishes
